# PROFILE: KEVIN CHISHOLM - "OUR FEARLESS LEADER"

At this time you can find him working with a phone at each ear, his computer in front of him, the adrenaline pumping and a smile on his face. In the midst of this frenzy, he and Kitsaun work closely with promoters, record company and publicist. I asked Kitsaun about Kevin. She said, "I think of Kevin as Our Fearless Leader. He has taken the band around the world time and again without mishap. He's the person who instituted our policy of letting children under the age of 12 into the concerts for free, when accompanied by an adult, in certain cities and venues. Kevin is one of the smartest people I know but even more importantly he's loving, kind and soulful. We work together as a team and I love

the recent July/August tour.


**SC**: Kevin, how did you begin your career in this industry?

KC: I actually got my first introduction in 1968 while still in high school. It was there that I first began producing our school theatre productions. After high school I became involved with the Westchester, NY chapter of Vietnam Vets against the War producing shows, plays and demonstrations.

SC: After that what did you do?

**KC**: Well, that was in NY, from there I decided to move to the west coast, first Los Angeles and then I moved to San Francisco. While in San Francisco, I teamed up with

four guys who owned a café on Haight Street called the Shady Grove. I then went back to school and took courses in sound and became a sound engineer.

SC: What did you do next?

**KC**: I began my own sound company and then I went to work for Bill Graham managing the venues and doing production.

SC: So, how did you connect with Santana?

## Our shows are all about the people; we care about our fans.

**SC**: In what capacity did you join Santana?

**KC**: I came into the Santana organization as the monitor engineer and production manager for one tour to get a feel for the staff, crew and tour philosophy and to see if I wanted to do the job. (a lot of laughter....)

**SC**: I guess you like the job, it's been about 15 years! When did you become the Tour Manager?

**KC**: After that first tour I worked as the production manager until 1989 when I was given the job of Tour Manager and "whatever."

**SC**: Generally, does a tour manager always do what the job description reads?

KC: No! A tour manager usually just operates the tour itself. I put the tour together, which entails negotiating the deals and planning the routing. I also work with the Management office, Carlos and the band during recording sessions. I'm a diversified person. (laughter)

**SC**: You are also working, living and managing many personalities often under some pretty stressful situations.

KC: I feel that you need to show respect, especially when you

tour in other countries. You need to respect the cultures of other countries.

SC: What is the most difficult aspect of your job?

KC: I don't find anything too difficult.

SC: OK, lets use the word challenging?

KC: I think that the most challenging is to put packages (tours) together that work well. What I mean by that is a package really works when we can move Carlos' career forward and that also puts Carlos in an environment that is safe.

SC: What is the most rewarding aspect of your job?

**KC**: The people, making the fans happy. Making sure that they are safe and are having a good experience.

SC: What was the toughest tour?

KC: I would have to say the 1988-touring season, which included the tour with Wayne Shorter and the Viva Santana tour. That was a tough year. I was doing production in 1988 and on one tour I slept maybe a total of 18-20 hours the entire five weeks we were out. We were going from airplane to airplane with the equipment.

**SC**: What do you enjoy most about working with this organization?

KC: The people in the Santana 'family,' and Carlos' philosophy. That was one of the reasons I wanted to stay with this organization. I am in agreement with much of the Santanas' philosophy and religiously we are similar. I was raised with many of the same beliefs and this is a comfortable environment. This is a family and my kids and my wife, Lynn, are all part of this family and I appreciate that.

SC: That is one aspect of this organization that is so special.

Our families are included in the fold.

**KC**: My kids appreciate it and that is one reason why they can handle my being away for such long stretches of time.

**SC**: Would you say that is one of the difficult aspects of your job?

KC: Yeah, it can be hard on the family.

**SC**: You hardly ever take time off, however. What do you look forward to during those off periods?

**KC**: Being with my family. When I'm home I involve myself with my children's sports activities. I'm involved either in the capacity of an assistant coach or as a proud father in the stands. I try never to miss their games.

SC: What has been the most memorable concert?

**KC**: Probably the concert in East Berlin. It was the people that made that show so special in my mind. The emotions at that show will always stay with me. I would also have to say the concert in Jerusalem. That was also a pretty amazing experience.

SC: What is your most favorite place to tour?

KC: I love it all, however, my favorite time is when we travel

through Europe. I love Germany.

**SC**: You were instrumental in the recording of **Supernatural**. How are you feeling about its success and the fact that it has gone to Platinum so quickly?

KC: I'm amazed. I feel that it is something that Carlos and the band deserve, and we must thank Arista. They have done an excellent job. SC: How is the present tour going? (July/August Summer Tour)

KC: This is the most phenomenal tour I've ever done in my life.

SC: Really! What makes this tour so special?

**KC**: I'm working with the best people, best music and the best package. I personally don't think anything can touch it. I have great people working around me and everyone is doing a great job. However, I give the most credit for this tour to Mike Keifer. (Santana Production Manager). He's a rock!

SC: How many crewmembers are travelling with you?

KC: We have 85 crewmembers that we are traveling with. However, it fluctuates and it has been as many as 92 and that does not include the local venue crew.

**SC**: I know that at this time (at the time of the interview) we have not confirmed a show for the millennium. What would you like to see for this special New Year's Eve show?

**KC**: As in all our shows my main focus is that the audience enjoy themselves. Our shows are all about the people; we care about our fans. It is not about greed, we understand that ticket prices are high and we are doing everything we can to make our shows affordable and safe.

SC: Thank you, Kevin.
