MYRON DOVE Past, Present, Future

Myron Dove and Carlos Santana have come full circle. Playing again with Carlos and the Santana Band, Myron is taking on a new challenge

with old friends. After playing bass for several years, Myron will now back Carlos up on rhythm guitar played on a Piccolo bass. The following interview with Myron Dove explains his past, present and future with Carlos Santana.

TT: Ho w did you first meet Carlos and how old were you?

MD: I met Carlos through

TONY, CHESTER, MYRON, Tony Lindsay, formerly of Spangalang, at the age of 25. The band was holding auditions. I went in and I was hired to play bass for Carlos Santana. That was in 1993 and I played with him for 5 years. TT: You have been on two Santana albums; which albums did you play on?

MD: I played on Sacred Fire Live in South America and Brothers. TT: Please describe what you have been doing since you left the band. MD: I have been playing with musicians such as Robben Ford, Tony Furtado, The American Gypsies, and Tracy Lyons. I also played in the stage production of Rent and did a lot of studio work with Narada Michael Walden as well as writing and producing.

TT: How did you and Carlos reconnect and how is your role different now?

MD: Carlos remembered me playing guitar so well on the Santana songs and he happened to be looking for a rhythm guitar player. He called and asked me to be a part of the band again. Carlos wants to keep a tight sound so he also hired Dennis Chambers to play drums. My role is different now because I am playing rhythm guitar instead of bass.

TT: So you were a bass player before you were a guitar player and now you are playing rhythm guitar on a Piccolo bass. Please tell us a little about how you are incorporating the two and describe a Piccolo bass. MD: Yes, I am actually playing rhythm guitar on a Piccolo bass that I run through a guitar amp. A regular bass is bigger than a Piccolo and a Piccolo is an octave higher - almost like a guitar with a longer neck. TT: How do you feel about playing guitar rather than bass?


MD: Physically the bass is a lot harder to play.

DENNIS CHAMBERS The New Heart of the Beat

Rhythm is the heartbeat of music and Dennis Chambers is the new heart pumping fresh beats and sounds into the lifeline of the Santana Band.

The time has finally presented itself for two amazing musicians to join forces. Dennis started playing the drums at the age of four and was performing at the age of six. Without any formal training, Dennis Chambers graduated into the life of drumming playing with Parliament and Funkadelic. In 1985 he joined Special EFX and in 1987 Chambers

played in the David Sanborn and John Scofield Band, which lasted until 1989. Since then he has played with bandleaders such as Bill Evans, Mike Urbaniak, George Duke, Stanley Clarke, Steve Kahn, The Brecker Brothers Band and many others. He has also recorded his own record Getting Even with Pioneer Records along with an instructional video with DCI.

Dennis is one of the most well respected drummers of our time and is in great demand to perform throughout the world. When he was in Europe with Mike Stern, we caught up with Dennis and he was gracious enough to take time to speak to us about his new project, The Santana Band.

TT: Hello Dennis. Thank you for taking time out of your busy schedule to introduce yourself to the Santana fans. I have to say, after researching your musical past; you have played with some of the world's best musicians. How did Carlos approach you?

DC: I was supposed to play with him back in '85 or '86. I was going to replace Chester Thompson, Carlos' drummer at the time. It did not happen because of lack of time to get it together. I was playing with John McLaughlin and we opened up for Carlos at one of the Swiss festivals, I think the Montreux Jazz Festival. Carlos at that time asked me to play but my time would not allow it, now recently (Santana) management called and asked me about doing a record. I said yes and now I am in the

TT:: Let's back up a little. You started playing drums at the age of four. Do you recall that particular moment that opened up your eyes and ears to music as a young child?

DC: My mom was a background singer for Motown. When I was one she put a band together in Baltimore. They would rehearse at my

MD: I am honored to play guitar with Carlos. I really can't wait to do the gigs and take the challenge. I just enjoy the cool vibe with all the different people. Things are better and smooth.

grandmother's house and I can still see the drums in my mind. I can even remember the color.

TT: Who were your mentors as a child?

DC: I have a cousin who used to play drums. That triggered it. I would watch him play and when he wasn't there, I would play his drums and he would kill me later (laughing). My mom played an amazing amount of music. She'd play Stax, rock, she was very versatile. That is why I play so many different kinds of music.

TT: As a grown man and seasoned veteran in the music world, what musical experience has made an impact on you? DC: I guess it's playing with all of these people that I grew

up listening to. It has been a big snowball effect. People like Carlos and George Clinton -- the list goes on.

TT: Do you feel like you are constantly learning about music?

DC: Definitely. There is so much different music out there like Latin and African. Unfortunately we do not hear this stuff in the US. Latin is growing. Radio is dedicated to pop and rock. It all sounds the same. I don't even listen to the radio any more.

TT: What words of wisdom do you want to share with young musicians?

DC:: Keep your ears open to different types of music. If you like rap that's fine, but just keep listening to other stuff. If you want to be a musician's musician, then be open and stay away from drugs.

TT: What will you bring to the Santana table, spiritually and musically?

DC: So far spiritually I bring my heart and my mind. To be as honest as possible to the music, like the other players, I bring my heart and my soul.

TT: You have a very busy schedule and you travel extensively. How do you maintain that lifestyle?

DC: It's very difficult, especially at this level. Today is my first day off in seven days and then we have another seven days straight. It's very difficult when you have a family at home.

TT: Do you have a wife and children back home?

DC: Yes I do.

TT: Musically do you have new challenges to face with your new project?

DC: Not really, musically I have played with every body. Chick (Corea), Mike Stern, George Clinton, Sly Stone. James Brown asked me to play with him when I was 13.

TT: Are there any additional comments you would like to make?

DC: It's important to know that we have to do a lot better with kids. They need guidance and to stay away from drugs and alcohol. One day I went back to Baltimore because my friend's father died. There was one church

left in my old neighborhood. That was the only building standing. It's sad. It once was a beautiful neighborhood and it's not there any more. Everything is all boarded up and it happened so fast. It's the drugs and alcohol. My grandmother used to live in a beautiful neighborhood and now it is demolished on both sides of the street. All of the houses are just gone. I couldn't find the house where I used to play. It's gone. It's sad because it's growing, the [use of] drugs. Today and tomorrow, we have to wake up.
